## West Palm Beach Dive

Location: West Palm Beach, Florida

Charter Boat: Pura Vida Divers /A1A Palm Beach Dive Charters

Date: March 26, 2005

The last weekend of lobster looked to be a perfect time to be diving. No waves, lots of sun and blue water. With 10 of us heading out for the dive, we were looking forward to a great day of diving. Only one snag with this trip . . . . Pura Vida's boat, the *Sirena*, was out of the water for repairs. The repairs were supposed to be complete on the Friday before the dive, but due to extenuating circumstances, they weren't getting the *Sirena* back into the water until Saturday afternoon. So here we were, Friday afternoon, before the last full weekend of lobster season, without a boat and 10 divers anxious to get in the water. Lucky for us, Pura Vida's staff managed to perform a small miracle and found a boat for our club dive the next morning.

The next morning was a great as the forecast had promised and we all boarded A1A Palm Beach Dive Charters Boat, the *Mardi Gras Float*. The first dive of the day was at South Double Ledges. Visibility was phenomenal at 70-80 feet. Next to no current and all the critters came out to greet us. We saw a large nurse shark, three large green moray eel (2 of them free swimming), a free swimming goldentail, a red grouper, nassau grouper, turtles and thousands of grunts, tomtates and cottonwicks. Tom Butler brought up the only lobster of the dive.

Second dive was at Fourth Windows. Another fabulous dive, another free swimming green moray eel, several spotted moray eels, another hawksbill turtle, scorpionfish and so on. Couldn't ask for a better day of diving — okay, I take that back — water temps were between 72 –74 degrees. Warmer water would have been nice, but the slight chill in the water didn't detract from the great day we were having.

Thanks to all the DUDC divers that went out on this trip: Christina Resner, Russell Bremmer, John Whitehead, Todd Johnson, Tom Butler, Dale Purchase, Doug Gould, and Gary & Jessica Buck. While we could dive alone, sharing the trip with such great people makes it even better.

As we pulled back into the dock, Pura Vida's boat, the *Sirena*, was back in its slip. Of course, that was all the prompting I needed and instead of loading gear into the truck, we just moved it over to the *Sirena* and ended up doing the afternoon trip and a night dive. Just another great day in paradise.

## Safe Ascents



Throughout all of our dive instruction, we're told the maximum safe ascent rate is 60 feet per minute (fpm). Over the past few years, several organizations have done a lot of research on ascent rates, and now NAUI, DAN, and other organizations are recommending 30fpm or slower. Ascending at 30fpm can be a very challenging task, even with a computer.

So, how slow is 30fpm? Take a rope and measure out 60 feet. Try to walk that length of rope and make sure it takes at least 60 seconds. Now, that's slow. Now, cut that speed in half. Can you do it? It's pretty difficult even with a reference line. Now, add the complexity of doing it in the water while ascending.

The most controlled method to ascend is to use an ascent line. By climbing the line hand over hand, you can easily control your ascent. An ascent line can be an anchor line, a mooring buoy, or even a marker buoy. Since most of your dives are drift dives, ascending using a marker buoy is our only option as an ascent line.

An alternative way to ascend without a computer is to use the 10 foot rule. If you want to ascend at 60 fpm, ascend 10 feet and hover for 10 seconds. Then ascend another 10 feet and hover again for 10 seconds. Repeat this process until you reach your safety stop. If you want to ascend at 30fpm, hover for 20 seconds. The "Nay sayers" will claim this method does not work, but if you have a computer that tracks your ascent rate, you'll find that you're actually going slower than the planned ascent rate. Why? In order to ascend 10 feet at a time, you have to do a slow controlled ascent. If you try to bolt up 10 feet, you'll blow right through the planned stop point. Therefore, you'll have a controlled safe ascent at or below your planned ascent rate.

The purpose for a slow ascent is to off-gas the excess nitrogen during your ascent. The slower you ascend, the more you reduce the risk of decompression illness. So, ascending at 30fpm is a good thing.

## Review of the Dive Club Cancellation Policy

As we get started with the diving season for 2005, I thought this would be a good time to go over the cancellation policy for the dive club. The first thing to keep in mind is this; **the cancellation policy is there for all of our members BENEFIT**. It is not meant to be nor will it be a policy that is unfair to our members. I know it can seem like a pain at times having to lock into a schedule two weeks or more out. Matter of fact, is what many people have done in the past (myself included) to avoid it was wait until the last minute to sign up. But it is my hope that this year we can provide: **a financial benefit** to signing up early, and make the cancellation policy and HOW to use it better understood. For the first objective, please see my article on the new tiered pricing schedule. The main purpose of this article is to achieve the second objective I noted above. How does the cancellation policy work and what are the exceptions? According to our bylaws, the cancellation policy reads as follows:

"Deposits will be refunded with 2 weeks notice of the scheduled event or with a paid replacement diver. Refunds of money paid after the 2 week cancellation period is subject to board approval. All request for refunds after this period **MUST** be made in writing. Money and deposits are refunded when dives are cancelled by the Charter or DUDC."

Key point there is that if you cancel within 2 weeks of the event you are subject to the loss of the trip fee. Even if you have not paid yet, your account will be billed for the trip. But there are **EXCEPTIONS**. The first is if you find a replacement diver. That doesn't mean calling the dive coordinator and asking them to find a replacement for you – that means **YOU** finding them. Speaking as a single dive coordinator, I will be happy to assist as long as you are making an effort also. Don't just call the dive coordinator and throw it in their lap. Second – you **CAN** submit in writing a request for a refund. As long as your request is reasonable, you have a **VERY** high likelihood of your request being granted. Things like illness (yourself or family) or unforeseen events like your transmission blowing up in your car are specific example where your request would most likely get approved. What the policy is trying to prevent is situations where individuals just decide at the last minute not to go for no specific reason. For example, if you just found out the Dolphins are playing that Sunday and you would rather stay home and watch the game. Ummm.. tape it ☺ That is an "avoidable" cancellation.

The only thing I think I think needs to be clarified in the policy is this. If the dive club has to pay for your slot on the trip, there is nothing we can do. Although, we work closely with the charters to build as much flexibility into our agreements as possible. They will pretty much follow the same guidelines as the Dive Club. Let's finish up by looking at **WHY** we have a cancellation policy in the first place. First and foremost is to make sure everyone has an equal opportunity to join us on our trips. Many times we have limited slots for our dives and if you hold one slot and then cancel at the last minute, someone else who may have wanted to attend my miss out. Second, as a dive club we establish a working relationship with the charters. I know Debi has developed an excellent relationship with Pura Vida and I am working on developing one with Jupiter Dive Center. These relationships are **VERY** beneficial to our club. It allows us to have a little more freedom on dive trips and **GREAT** opportunities on pricing. But for our part, it is important to remember that they are running a business. They are selling us a discounted seat on their boat. When we cancel at the last minute, they may not have time to fill it. So they end up losing out twice.

So after reading this I hope the cancellation policy makes a little more sense and doesn't seem quite as hard as it might first appear. I still remember when I first joined the club and thinking the two week policy was nuts. It seemed like a policy that **PREVENTED** people from signing up early – so I just waited till the last minute to sign up. And trust me – that only makes the job of your dive coordinator even harder. We start working with the charters over a week out trying to give them a feel for what our final counts are going to be. Having to wait until those last few days is very stressful on the dive coordinator and the Charters.

### New Tiered Pricing Structure

I don't know about you, but I am always wishing I could dive more often. But I find two things keep getting in my way. The first is other family commitments, and the second is well, I just can't afford to go as often as I would like.

Not much I can do to help you with the first, but as a dive club we have received some VERY attractive pricing through Jupiter Dive Center. As all the charters in the WPB and Jupiter area are increasing their standard fees to \$50 and \$55 per two tank trip, I have negotiated a club rate of **\$35 per diver**. This represents a **35% price cut** of the standard walk up rate (\$53.75 with tax).

The people who are going to benefit the most from this price are the people who sign up early. We are going to have two pricing tiers based on when you sign up. For people who sign up 1 week or more before the trip, you will receive the fully discounted price of \$35. The second tier is for people who sign up between 3-7 days prior to the event and that price will be \$45. Even the second tier represents over a 15% discount!

TIER	SIGNUP PERIOD (before dive)	PRICE	REFLECTS DISCOUNT
1	7+ Days	\$35	35%
2	3-7 Days	\$45	15%

So as you can see, we have a GREAT opportunity in front of us this year. But there are a couple of caveats to this. The deadline for signup is at 72 hours! I have to let the charter know our final counts at that point. We are also limited to 8-10 slots at this rate. So SIGN UP early and get the best price while at the same time guaranteeing yourself a spot. And keep in mind, as I discussed in the "Review of the Cancellation" policy – there is flexibility if your plans need to change.

An emergency can happen to anyone in or around the water, regardless of how good a diver the person is. Trouble can arise without warning due to medical conditions, sudden changes in the environment or an unexpected variable that no one can reasonably foresee. The most common cause of diver emergencies, however, is poor judgment. Remember that planning a dive is, in part, a risk assessment. Failing to use good judgment when assessing risk can lead to diver emergencies.
