For those of you not familiar with Dr. Shenker, he is an Associate Professor at Florida Institute of Technology and one of his major research efforts is on the use of artificial reefs by fish populations. This project involves extensive scuba surveys using visual and video monitoring of a series of massive artificial reefs deployed in 70 feet of water 10 miles off the Florida coast. Dr. Shenker also runs the summer field program in Australia on the marine and terrestrial ecosystems of that region of the world. Dr. Shenker will be talking about the trip he took FL Tech students on to Australia, and update us on the status of the SISA artificial reefs.

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Best Dive of the Year (Not)

This was try #2 for a number of us to dive the Rankin out of Stewart. The first time was weathered out, but we go some good dives in right out of the inlet. This time we all waited in anticipation for the Best Dive of the Year on 7 Jan. (In this treatise, consider Best and First interchangeable!). However, as the day drew nearer the weather forecast grew more menacing and one by one the multitude of divers originally interested dwindled to three!! So on the dedicated day for the expedition south we rendezvoused at 0700 at the Waffle House at Malabar Rd and I-95 prepared to undertake the required trials and tribulations that would lead to an adventurous dive on the Rankin and the successful culmination of our "Rankin Adventure".


Phil Kellner, Tom Butler and I rejoiced in the drive south (trying to avoid seeing the foreboding dark clouds in front of us) as we recalled great diving adventures of the past and grandiose plans for future dives!! Traffic was light and our spirits were high! We arrived at Jupiter Dive Center (JDC), still with a blind eye to the gathering cumulus clouds and the message they were sending us. Well, the dive master quickly brought us back to earth under the dark clouds and advised us the Rankin was a no-go for that day; seas were 2-4 feet and building!! But, we could slip out the inlet and do a couple of close in dives before it got too, too bad! There were several other divers interested in that so we jumped at the opportunity to get wet and proceeded to load our gear and head out! Well we got wet about half way out the inlet when a large ocean roller came over the bow of the Republic IV dive boat! Not quite what we meant we said we wanted to get wet!! Nonetheless, we continued into the building seas and reached Scarface Reef in short order. The 2-4 ft seas had built into 4-6 ft by now, but we wanted to dive!!!

We made it in with little trouble, viz was not bad at about 25-30 feet. Water temp was an acceptable 75 degrees and while there was s strong surge at the reef (65-80 feet) it was manageable and not too disruptive. First off we saw a 3-4 ft turtle heading for the surface, he returned our wave and continued on. Next we encountered the reef's namesake, Scarface, the Green Moray eel, who stuck his large head out of this tunnel and let us examine his scar, but did not hang out long enough to tell us any of his myriad adventures involved in developing the scar. We continued along the reef seeing various types of reef citizens, all were doing well.

Eventually, the time to rise came and we headed to the surface. Seas were now approximately 60-80 feet or so it looked to me from sea level! Unfortunately, we always seemed to be in the trough and not on the wave where we could see anything!! We inflated our sausages, but in the strong wind they did not stick up very high! However after about 15 minutes the dive boat came into view and positioned itself for a convenient boarding by our team!


We were glad for the Christmas tree ladder that made boarding relatively easy, but still not a piece of cake! Once on board we rested in the covered cabin before beginning to remove our gear. Seas continued to build it seemed as we sat our surface interval! Soon the wave caps seemed to be smashing into the lowering clouds; nonetheless several hearty souls decided to go for one more dive. We, the faithful DUDC, team decided to exercise good judgment and sit this one out. After returning to dock we unloaded our gear and headed home with the Best Dive of the Year over with and knowing that the next one could only be better!!

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Our First Dive of 2004





We decided to take advantage of the unseasonably warm weather and go diving. Unfortunately, right after we scheduled the trip the weather changed a storm blew through bringing colder weather and high waves. Luckily, by the time the day of the dive rolled around, it was much calmer, though still a little chilly.

After a quick sign in at Pura Vida's shop, Gary, Jessica and I headed to Phil Foster Park and boarded the *Sirena*, anxious to get our first dive of the year started. The seas were virtually flat as we headed toward's Paul's Reef. Visibility was about 40'-

50' with very little current. This site was teeming with all of the usual tropicals along with 2 lemon sharks, several spotted moray eels and lobsters. All in all a great dive. By the time we had surfaced from our dive, the topside conditions had changed. Seas increased to 2' - 3' and the temperature had dropped almost 15 degrees. Luckily, we had brought a thermos of hot chocolate with us. Unfortunately, somebody left the coats in the car (*oops*), which left anxious to get back in the water where

it was warmer.

Our second dive was at Moray Alley. This is always a nice dive and this time wasn't any different. We saw a loggerhead turtle and more spotted moray eels in addition to the abundant tropicals. When we surfaced from this dive, we were told that captain and crew had spotted a hammerhead on the surface just after we descended. Overall it was great dive trip and a good way to start the new year.

Answer. C (Ascends).

Excessive hyperventilation reduces body carbon dioxide to such a low level that a person loses consciousness before breathing stimulus occurs. Increased oxygen partial pressure at depth aids an experienced breath-hold diver. The oxygen partial pressure decreases rapidly during ascent. The low oxygen level causes unconsciousness, or 'shallow water blackout'. Avoid hyperventilating more than three or four breaths prior to a breath-hold dive.
